# Planning Aphorisms

# Authorities

- Why do municipalities need local emergency plans?
  - 20 V.S.A § 6 and 2013 State Emergency Operations Plan - Each town and city of this state is hereby authorized and directed to establish a local organization for emergency management in accordance with the state emergency management plan and program...
  - 2013 Vermont National Incident Management System (NIMS) Implementation Plan - requires plan as a condition of receiving federal preparedness funds
  - 20 V.S.A. § 45 - requires plan for increased state reimbursement of infrastructure losses through the Emergency Relief and Assistance Fund (ERAF)



# Background

- Replaces Local Emergency Operations Plan (LEOP) ...which replaced Basic Emergency Operations Plan (BEOP) ...which replaced the Rapid Response Plan (RRP)
- LEOP Issues:
  - Primarily seen as check-the-block tool for reporting to the state
  - Contact info most useful part during an emergency
  - Single format mandated for all towns and cities
  - Forms hard to customize
- Working Group
  - Goal: action-oriented framework that guides a municipality in coordinating emergency operations
  - 1 VEM rep, 2 RPC reps, 3 EMDs
  - Drafted and refined requirements and templates between October 2017 and March 2018
- VEM announced LEMP requirements on May 7, 2018

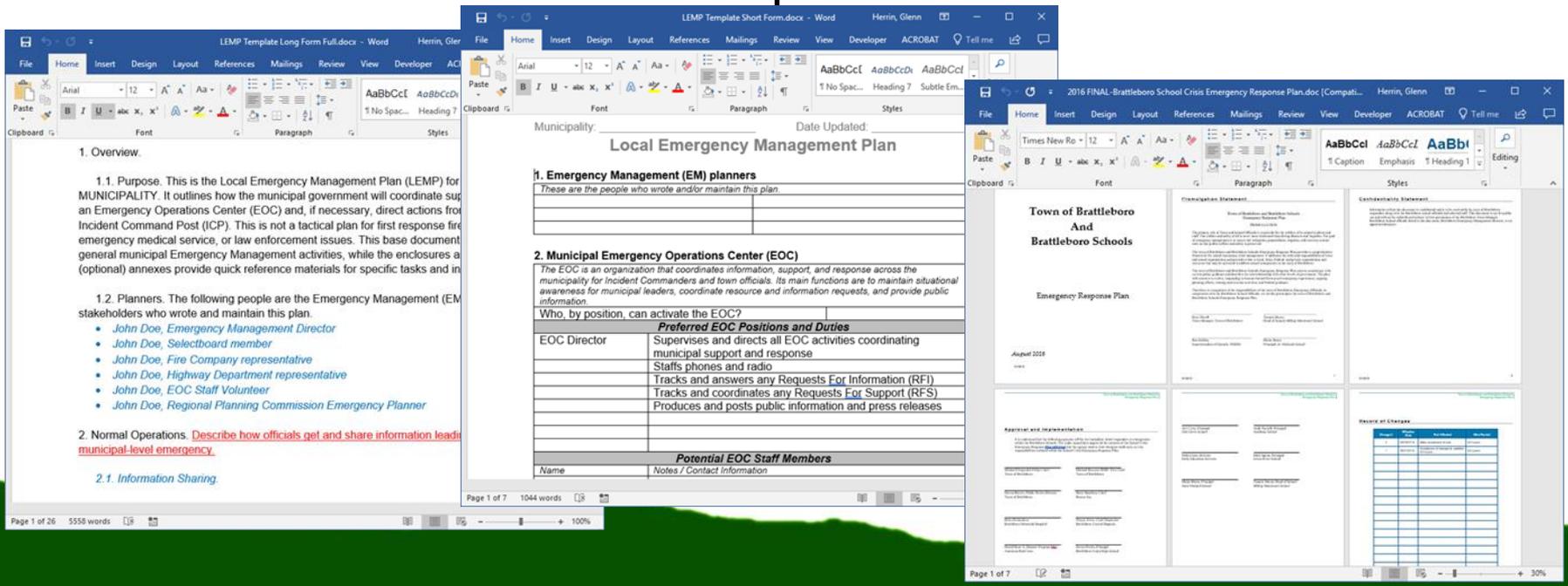

- Activation authority

- Facility information for potential EOC locations (minimum 1)

# Requirements

## - Resources

What do you have, what can you get, and how do you get it?

- Emergency purchasing agent and spending limits (if any)
- List of municipal contracts that can be used during an emergency (if any)
- List of other local resources that could be used during an emergency (if any)
- National Incident Management System (NIMS) Typed Resource List

# Requirements

How do you tell the public  
what's going on?

## - Public Information and Warning

- VT-Alert contact information
- Local website / social media info (if any)
- List of local media outlets (if any)
- Public notice sites for non-phone/Internet information
- Vermont 2-1-1 contact information



How do you find out  
who needs help?

# Requirements

## - Vulnerable Populations

- List of organizations/facilities that serve local vulnerable populations
- Identification and monitoring process



# Requirements

## - Shelters

Where do people go if they can't stay home?

- Spontaneous and regional shelter information
- Opening information for local shelters (if any)
- Service information for local shelters (if any)



# Requirements

## - Contact Information

How do you get in touch with everyone who can help?

- Emergency Management personnel
- Response organizations
- Municipal officials / public works
- State, region, and adjacent municipality contacts





# State LEMP Use

- VEM records key contact info from adoption form and uses it to contact key leaders during emergencies
- VEM files current local plans...
  - As a backup in case originals are damaged or lost
  - For record, in case there is a question of grant eligibility
  - For reference, in case the state needs to request local resources during an emergency
