


## Inundation Flood Zones:



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# River Corridor (Fluvial Erosion Hazard):











# Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities (BRIC):

- Annual funding program
- Waiting on the Notice of Funding for BRIC 2023
- \$2 million set-aside for Vermont in BRIC 2022
- State Deadline: Generally early December
- Eligible Applicants: State agencies, Regional Planning
   Commissions and municipalities

# Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities (BRIC):

#### Best Use:

- Project Scoping: analysis of alternatives, designs, budget, scoping and Benefit-Cost Analysis (BCA) for preferred alternative
  - Broad area (neighborhood with flood risk)
  - Single structure (i.e., bridge or culvert)
- Local Hazard Mitigation Plan Development/Updates
- Other Planning Activities

# Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities (BRIC):

- Approved Local Hazard Mitigation Plan (LHMP) at time of application submittal and award
  - \*not required if you're applying to develop an LHMP
- 75% Federal Funding, 25% Local Match
  - 90% Cost Share is available for certain communities with a population under 3,000 and economically disadvantaged
- 5% of total project costs to manage the project (no match required)

# Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP):

- Funding follows declared disasters
- July flooding open funding round:
  - DR-4720: **\$30 million** anticipated available
- Deadline: Summer 2024
- Benefit-Cost Analysis (BCA) support is available

## Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP):


#### Best Use: Project Implementation

- Property Buyouts:
  - Property buyouts in the Special Flood Hazard Area (SFHA)
  - Property buyouts with significant landslide risk
  - Benefit Cost Analysis (BCA) is <u>not required</u> if the total project cost is below \$323K
- Other Flood Reduction Projects: (BCA Required)
  - Culvert/bridge upsizing
  - Road relocation/road resilience
  - Floodplain restoration
  - Floodproofing/elevations

### Program Requirements:

- Approved Local Hazard Mitigation Plan (LHMP) at time of application submittal and award
- 75% Federal share, 25% local match
  - No local match for property buyouts
  - Local ARPA funding can be used as match if it is part of your revenue loss
  - 5% of total project costs to manage the project (no match required)

# Program Purpose:

Improving landscape and community resilience and reducing the future public safety and water quality impacts of climaterelated flood hazards in Vermont.






#### Flood Resilient Communities Fund:

- Created by the Vermont Legislature in May 2021 with funding through the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA)
- \$4.88 million allocated in 2021
- \$14.75 million allocated in 2022




# FY2023 Funding Round:

- Application accepted on a rolling basis
- Funding to be obligated by Dec. 31, 2024
- Funding to be spent by Dec.
  31, 2026



# Eligible Projects:

- Flood-vulnerable structure and buyout projects
- Vacant at-risk parcel buyout/conservation
- Natural resource projects to improve floodplain access/function
- Project scoping, planning, education and outreach initiatives




# Project Prioritization:

- Where feasible, funding under FEMA's Hazard Mitigation
   Assistance (HMA) grant programs should be utilized first
- Leverage other funding sources or fill funding gaps to make projects viable
- Prioritize projects in communities and/or for homeowners with greatest economic need and projects that mitigate repetitive loss

## By the Numbers:

- \$14 million obligated to date
  - Buyouts/Demolition: \$8.2 million
  - Restoration/Dam Removal: \$4.4 million
  - Scoping & Planning: \$700k
